### Benefits

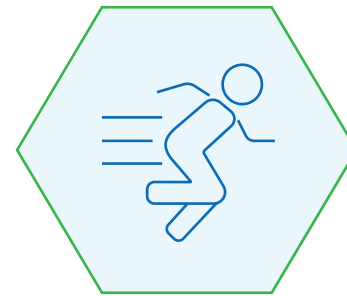
Internal debates are an integral part of the decision-making process, ensuring comprehensive conclusions

Small to mid-sized companies that have a few compounds in their pipeline

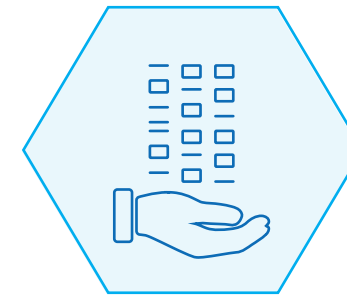
### Benefits
